
Identifying Household Hazardous Waste (HHW)

Household Hazardous Waste (HHW) should not be disposed of in the trash, recycling, gutter, or flushed down the toilet. Improper handling of these products can damage our environment and pose a serious threat to public health and safety. It is also against the law.

Look for warnings on product labels such as Hazardous, Corrosive, Flammable, or Poisonous.

Examples include: Paint (all kinds), Thinners, Varnishes, Glues, Solvents, Cleaners, Aerosol sprays, Medications, Nail polish & remover, Antifreeze, Motor oil, Fuel, Pesticides, Weed killers, Fertilizers, CFLs, Batteries, Pool chemicals, Photo chemicals, Mercury containing items

Electronic Waste

E-waste is any item with a circuit board (usually with a digital display). These materials are recyclable at the Arcata Community Recycling Center and Eureka Recycling Center (fees apply).

Examples include: CPUs, Computer monitors & accessories, Laptops, Printers, Copiers, TVs, Microwaves, Telephones, Answering machines, Stereo equipment, VCR/DVD players, Portable music devices, Cell phones, PDAs

Appliances

Recyclable at the Arcata Community Recycling Center and Eureka Recycling Center (fees apply).

Examples include: Hot water heaters, Refrigerators, Freezers, Dehumidifiers, Washers, Dryers, Stoves

Medical Sharps

Home-generated needles and syringes are accepted at the Arcata Community Recycling Center in designated sharps containers only.
