Recreation Division

The Recreation Division provides a wide array of public programs and coordinates the city's Special Events, Film, and Plaza Vending Permits and the Bayside Park Community Garden applications. The Division also serves as a clearinghouse for information regarding activities and services offered by other City Departments and local service providers. The Recreation Division employs four full-time and numerous part-time staff. In addition, the City works with Humboldt State University to sponsor intern and contract class instructors. Community volunteers support City programs including Youth Basketball, Drop-In Activities, Holiday Craft Market, Bowl of Beans Benefit, All Seasons Orchestra, City Arts, and Play Center

Programs, Classes and Community Events



Some of the Recreation Division's programs are seasonal, such as Redwood Day Camp and Youth Basketball. Year round programs include Gymnastics, Drop-In Activities, the All Seasons Orchestra, and a variety of youth and adult contract classes. All Recreation programs are coordinated by city staff. The City of Arcata Recreation Division complies with the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA), which prohibits discrimination on the basis of a disability. The Recreation Division will make reasonable accommodations in recreation programs to enable participation by individuals with a disability who meet essential eligibility requirements. Recreation programs offered by Arcata Recreation are available in the most integrated setting appropriate for each individual.

Recreation Division programs and classes generated \$381,657 in total revenue during 2018. Many children and adults register for classes or programs multiple times throughout the year. In 2012, the Recreation Division introduced online registration to better serve community members. Online registration continues to be well utilized.

CREATING COMMUNITY

All Seasons Orchestra

The All Seasons Orchestra is comprised of musicians ranging in age from 13 to 79 years old. The Orchestra, which includes string, woodwind, brass, and percussion, rehearses at D St. Neighborhood Center year-round and performs multiple free local concerts for audiences of 75-100. Additionally, three sub-groups played at the City's Holiday Craft Market. The group elects a volunteer coordinator annually and is directed by a volunteer conductor to keep the grassroots atmosphere originally established by the Roddens.

Bayside Park Community Garden

Individuals and families can rent 4 X 25-foot garden plots for to grow organic fruit, vegetables and flowers for non-commercial use. Each plot rents for \$75 per year for Arcata Residents and \$86 for non-residents. The final plan, approved by the City's Parks and Recreation Committee, includes 36 plots.



Bowl of Beans Benefit

The Annual Bowl of Beans benefit typically has over 500 participants for an evening of beans, rice, guest speakers, and performances by various musicians. The event is made possible by 200+ volunteers including volunteer performers including Baba Jamal Koram, Arcata Interfaith Gospel Choir and Children's Choir, Asha Nan and students from Arcata Elementary School's dance classes. Volunteers from the California Conservation Corps, Spark Corp., and the Watershed Stewards as well as parents and teachers from Arcata Elementary School assist with set up, food prep, serving, and clean up. This event is a shared fundraiser with Arcata Elementary School and the City of Arcata.

Holiday Craft Market

The 19th Annual Holiday Craft Market was held in December. Handcrafted items were donated by vendors and awarded to lucky raffle ticket winners. Proceeds benefit the Youth Development Fund. The market continues to grow in popularity with approximately 1,600 shoppers attending the two-day market. Community volunteers help with the event by providing live music. The proceeds from the event support the Recreation Division's Youth Development Scholarship Fund.

Plays in the Park

Community Theater had a successful return to Redwood Park in 2018. Plays in the Park featured Sunday matinee performances of Young Merlin. In addition, a one-day Park Fest premiered to positive reviews as a community driven theatrical event. Productions were put on by North Coast Repertory Theatre.

Challenge Course

Located at Redwood Park, this course provides the community with a resource for team building, personal development, and expanding one's experiences as an individual or teammate. In 2018, the City's Redwood Day Camp and Adventure Camp summer programs utilized the Challenge Course for ten weeks. Additionally, the Recreation Division coordinates private challenge courses for school and community groups.



PROMOTING HEALTH AND WELLNESS



Drop-In Activities

This year, Recreation Division Drop-In programs averaged 413 participants monthly. Youth and adults participate in basketball, volleyball, table tennis, badminton, pickle ball, samba drumming, hula dancing, song circle, ukulele club, and nerf war. City volunteers facilitated a majority of these programs. The fee is \$3 per drop-in session.

Gymnastics

The gymnastics program offers ongoing sessions throughout the year. The Judo Hut program, for children ages 15 months-5 years, is a movement program using gymnastics-related skills and games to encourage the development of social skills, flexibility, strength, and coordination. Classes are held in the Judo Hut. The Artistic Gymnastics program, held at the Arcata Community Center, serves children 6-17 years of age. Students are coached through skill progressions developed by USA Gymnastics. To celebrate and demonstrate all they have learned, gymnasts have the opportunity to participate in annual winter and spring performances. Friday Night Flips offers 5-12 year olds an opportunity to drop in and play at the Arcata Community Center Gymnastics Room. In addition, the Saturday morning drop-in program at the Judo Hut for 15 months-4 year olds, continues to gain momentum. There were 1,424 registrants in gymnastics for the year.

Special Olympics Tournaments and Young Athletes Program

The Recreation Division partners with Special Olympics Northern California and Humboldt State University to coordinate the Annual Bocce Bonanza for local High School students with differing abilities. This is the seventh year for this one-day event which includes both doubles and four person teams compromised of nearly 70 participants. HSU student volunteers helped make the event a success. The Young Athletes Program is another partnership program that provides children ages 3-7 years an introduction into the world of sport through activities that increase skills and reduce barriers.

Youth Basketball

The Youth Basketball Program served 540 youth between 1st and 12th grade on 54 teams. In all, there were nine divisions, split by age and gender, with a 9th-12th grade boys and girls combined division. Revenue was generated through registration fees of \$65 per child (\$76 non-resident) and sponsor fees. Sponsors donate funds for the privilege of having their name on team shirts and being included in advertising.



The annual "Silent Weekend" took place again this year to promote positive sportsmanship among spectators. Fans were encouraged to show their support by clapping while refraining from all verbal cheering.

All teams practice weekly at the Arcata Community Center and play games every Saturday throughout the nine-week season. In addition to the Arcata Community Center; Jacoby Creek School, Pacific Union School and Sunny Brae Middle School were used for the games. The Recreation Supervisor serves as the program coordinator supervising paid staff and volunteer coaches.

FOSTERING YOUTH DEVELOPMENT

Adventure Camp

This camp serves 9 to 14-year-old adventure seekers and was held for all ten weeks this summer, an increase from the six offered in 2018. Themed weeks focused on camper skill development in shelter building, knots, hiking, mountain biking, track identification, compasses, maps, GPS, fire building, camp safety, backpacking, and first aid.



Arcata Break Camps

The Division offers camps during school breaks. A camp for kindergarten through fifth graders was held during Thanksgiving, 2-week Winter Break, Presidents' Week and Spring Break at the Teen Room in the Arcata Community Center. The camp was offered as half-day or full-day with extended care starting at 8 am and ending at 5:30pm at no additional charge. The Division also offers daily and half-day options. This successful camp enables registrants to participate in daily arts and crafts projects, games and activities. Revenue and participation totals vary year to year as the dates of the second week of Winter Break Camp fluctuate and dictates whether camp takes place before or after the New Year.

Art Camp/Young Creators Art Camp



Art Camp provides fun art experiences for youth ages 7-12 years at the Arcata Community Center. Five weeks of camp were offered throughout the summer. Two Co-Directors worked to create a fun atmosphere where kids work on a variety of art projects that included, ceramics, collage, marble paintings, murals and more.

The summer also offered four weeks of Young Creators Art Camp. Young Creators is an art camp for ages 4-6 years. Participants used a wide variety of mediums to explore and create.

Birthday Parties

The Division hosted Art and Gymnastics birthday parties this year. Two staff members supervise games, crafts and activities during a two-hour party. The Recreation Division provides the facilities, supervision and fun, while the parent supplies the guests and refreshments. We offer families birthday celebrations with no stress or mess.

City Arts

During 2018 City Arts hosted a variety of art classes for youth in our community including Family Ceramics for families with children ages 6 and up. In the fall, we added an Adult Ceramics Class following the Family Class. In addition to our ceramics classes, youth participated in Holiday Castles and Graham Cracker Houses class for ages 4-10 years in December. Throughout the year we offer Arts and Crafts birthday parties.

Dance Camp/Mini Movers Dance Camp

Open to dancers of all levels, campers aged 4-6 years (Mini Movers Dance Camp) and 7-9 years (Dance Camp) are able to experiment with different dance styles while working on core competency at the Redwood Lounge in Redwood Park and/or Arcata Community Center Gymnastics Room. Six one-week sessions of Ballet, Jazz, World, and Hip Hop were provided. Each week concluded with a Friday Dance Performance.

Leader-In-Training

Leaders-In-Training (L.I.T.) work with youth ages 4-12 years, helping plan and lead activities, games, fieldtrips, and more. Registrants, ages 13-17 years, gain first hand work experience through the L.I.T Program. L.I.T.s earn community service hours while acting as role models to our campers. Teens leave the program with job experience, professional references, and a summer of positive memories. All summer camps utilized the help of L.I.T.s.



Marsh Camp/Young Explorers Camp

Once again, camps were offered at the Arcata Marsh Interpretive Center. Themes focused on water, species, and the marsh habitat. Five weeks of Young Explorers Camp were offered for 4-6 year olds as well as four weeks of Marsh Explorers Camp for youth 7-9 years. Youth investigated the natural world through experiments, individual projects and engaging science learning.

Play Center

In partnership with First 5 Humboldt, the Arcata Play Center offers a safe comfortable environment for families to meet and share parenting and play experiences with their infants and children up to five years of age. Play Center meets at the D St. Neighborhood Center on Mondays, Tuesdays and Wednesdays from 10am - 12pm. A \$3 daily drop-in donation per child is requested, but not required, to attend. Throughout the year, families are provided with workshops addressing nutrition, car seat safety, parenting support and developmental stages. Play Center benefits from HSU student volunteers and interns.

In 2018, Play Center received \$31,576 in funding. First 5 Humboldt County granted \$14,250 to the Play Center Program. Humboldt County Office of Education granted \$1,104 to Arcata Play Center Nutrition Program. Play Center Fundraisers earned \$1,492 from participant donations and \$1,333 from Pop-Up Shop & Auction Events. Additionally, Humboldt County Department of Health and Human Services granted \$13,397 to Arcata Play Center Ages and Stages Developmental Screening efforts. Through this funding staff began to change the culture and community understanding of early childhood screening and developmental milestones through education and access to questionnaires and resources.

Redwood Day Camp

The Recreation Division finished another year of Redwood Day Camp on a very successful note. Full-day and half-day spots were available. The fee for full-day camp was \$145/week (\$155 non-resident), and \$105/week (\$115 non-resident) for half-days. A total of 1035 youth participated in a number of daily activities including arts & crafts, games, and fieldtrips. Redwood Day Camp also held two overnights at Redwood Park. The program employed twelve seasonal staff.

The City of Arcata again offered low element Challenge Course activities one day a week for the ten weeks of Redwood Day Camp. In addition, children have opportunities to swim weekly at the Arcata Pool and go on fieldtrips to areas of interest such as the Arcata Fire and Police Stations, The Minor Theater, the Natural History Museum as well as the Sequoia Park Zoo. For the second year, we were able to take campers aboard the MADAKET. This was made possible through the Explore the Coast Grant from The California Coastal Conservancy. While aboard, campers learned about the unique natural and cultural history of Humboldt Bay.

Redwood Day Camp also serves as a distribution site for the USDA and Department of Education's Food for People Summer Food Service Program. This past year 649 lunches were served, free of charge, to local youth.

Skate Camp

At Skate Camp youth, ages 6-14 years, of all skill levels learn how to be safe and have fun at our local skate park. Instructed in partnership with AMPT Skate Shop, this program focuses on park safety, etiquette, street and vert riding, and style. Youth strengthen their skills during five, week-long sessions.



Theater Camp

Theater Camp participants, ages 9 to 14 years, tell stories, play theater games and learn about stagecraft in the fresh air under the Redwoods. All skill levels are welcome. Each Friday features a camp performance for family and friends! Themes include: Improv, Physical Theater, Melodrama/Musical Theater and Shakespeare and Classics.



Contract Classes

A number of classes are offered through the Recreation Division by individual contractors. Contractors plan, organize, and supervise classes, and receive 60% of the revenue. The revenue retained by the Division is used to offset the cost of advertising, facility use, registration, and administration. Contract Classes had 643 participants in 2018.

Youth Development Scholarship Fund

The Youth Development Scholarship Fund provides fee reductions to youth from low-income families. The fund relies solely upon grants, donations, and fundraisers to provide this invaluable service to the community. In 2018 Arcata Recreation provided 30% fee reductions to all youth of qualifying families. During 2018, 356 scholarships were awarded for classes, programs, and camps providing a total of \$9,476 in assistance. These children attended Gymnastics classes, Summer Camps, Youth Basketball, Arcata Break Camp and Youth Contract Classes. Donations are received from Humboldt Sponsors, Humboldt Area Foundation, Six Rivers Bocce Club, and local residents and businesses. The Recreation Division hosts the Holiday Craft Market to support the Youth Development Scholarship Fund.

PARKS AND FACILITIES DIVISION

The Parks and Facilities Division is responsible for the design, development, landscaping and maintenance of Arcata's City parks and facilities. The Division maintains 30 open space areas totaling 106 acres. This system includes neighborhood and community parks, 15 playgrounds, nine athletic fields, special use and linear parks (tennis, skateboarding, bocce, pickle ball, greenways), non-motorized trail systems, family picnic areas, community gardens and farm, the downtown Plaza and open space areas. Appendix 2 lists City Park amenities and regulations. The Parks Division continues to work to develop Carlson Park, in the Mad River Business Park Development. Carlson will eventually have trail access to the Mad River. Additionally, the Division completed design and renovation of Ennes Park. Planning for a basketball court in at Valley West Park and a futsal court at the Arcata Community Center were completed and construction of both those facilities will be completed in 2019. Design for upgrades to the Arcata Ball Park were finalized with construction to be completed before the opening of the Crabs 75th season. The Parks and Facilities division cleans and maintains City buildings and landscaping, parking lots, pedestrian corridors, roadway and sound-wall landscaping, and graffiti abatement. Vandalism clean up and repair also falls to the Parks and Facilities Division.

The Parks & Recreation Divisions share the responsibility of renting City facilities and supporting community events, activities and tournaments. The Parks and Facilities Divisions maintain, prepare and support activities scheduled at the City's buildings, parks and sports fields. The Parks and Facilities Division includes nine full-time and 12 part-time (FTE) employees. In addition, community members continue to volunteer with the Adopt-A-Park Program and provide ongoing maintenance and community beautification.

Field Rentals and Use

The City accommodated 2,826.75 hours of the requested 2,826.75 hours of field time in 2018. Often groups call in to check availability prior to submitting a written request and are informed it is already scheduled. This unmet need is not reflected in the table below. This year there were 270.5 hours of rainouts resulting in a total of 2,562.25 field reservation hours. See Appendix 3 for complete information on field reservations and use.

The Parks Division maintains nine sports fields and courts that are used by a variety of groups for practice, tournaments, and league play in softball, baseball, soccer, ultimate Frisbee, tennis, pickleball and bocce. The City operates four baseball/softball fields: The Arcata Ball Park, Sports Complex North and South and Pacific Union Park. Multi-use fields include the Pacific Union Field (two "under 12"/one full-size soccer) and the Sports Complex (two full-size fields/one "under 12").

Many organizations use the fields maintained by the City. Groups include: Humboldt Crabs, Arcata High School (AHS), Humboldt State University (HSU), College of the Redwoods, Mad River Softball Association (MRSA), Arcata Little League (ALL), Senior Softball, Special Olympics, Humboldt Soccer League (HSL), Eagles Baseball, Football Club Samoa, USTA/Humboldt Tennis, US Coast Guard, Temple Beth El, North Coast Preparatory Academy, Humboldt Fast Pitch Softball Association, Northern Humboldt Steelheads, Pacific Union School, Jacoby Creek School and Mad River Youth Soccer League (MRYSL), Humboldt Soccer Academy, and American Legion Baseball. Additionally the tennis courts were reserved for 217 hours and served 1499 participants.

Revenue for field/court/plaza use totaled \$76,337.96. Summer, then Fall was the most heavily used season.

Buildings

The City provides seven buildings for rent: The Arcata Community Center, Redwood Lodge, Redwood Lounge, Arcata Marsh Interpretive Center, D St. Neighborhood Center, the Library Conference Room and the Judo Hut. The Parks and Facility Division maintains these buildings as well as City Hall, the Library, Transit Building, Arcata Resource Center and Public Works Annex.



Building Rentals and Use

During 2018, city buildings were used for a total of 19,432.75 hours. Over 33,329 people attended events held at the Arcata Community Center, Redwood Lodge, Library Conference Room, Redwood Lounge, Larson Park Gazebo, the D St. Neighborhood Center, the Judo Hut and the Arcata Marsh Interpretive Center. City Hall and the Transit Center provide daily services to the community. Revenue generated from these building rentals totaled \$65,078.20. Building rentals accounted for 1,980 hours of use. City programs and events used the facilities 9,005.5 hours. The Arcata Marsh Interpretive Center was open for 2,552 hours. Table D shows the number of hours each facility was used and the revenue generated from building rentals. For a complete breakdown of facility use by building, see Appendices 4-9.

Arcata Community Center

The Arcata Community Center was the site for many programs, activities, and community rentals this year. Throughout the year the facility was scheduled for 6,773.25 hours of use. Of that, 968.75 hours were for community events such as wedding receptions, graduation parties, and fund-raisers for local non-profit agencies. Rental revenues totaled \$44,270.39 for the year. The Recreation Division held 2,703.75 hours of classes or programs while other departments and joint use partners used the building 133.25 hours. The Senior Resource Center scheduled 2,967.5 hours of activities. This includes the lunch program, exercise classes, Tai Chi, site counseling, table screenings, movies, and card games. See Table D, for a breakdown of the hours used by facility users.

Special Events



Special Events are community-coordinated events that occur at City parks and facilities. Special Event Permits are required for any event that uses a city park, requires road closures, or extra city services. The Recreation Division handles the permitting process and coordinates setup and maintenance with the Parks Division. The Parks Division is responsible for facility and park preparation, coordination of sound, electrical and water use, and facility/park clean up. The Environmental Services Departments provide fencing and barricades for street closures. The Police Department may step up patrols in neighborhoods or in some cases actually assign officers to events.

These events, such as Godwit Days and Kinetic Sculpture Race, give Arcata its unique flavor and attract many visitors. Many events raise funds for local causes, non-profit agencies, or unique community needs. In addition to raising funds, special

In 2018 approximately 100,700 people attended 104 Special Events based on estimates provided by event coordinators during the application process. Special Event Fees totaled \$18,532.75 See Appendix 10 for a complete list of all Special Events in 2018.

Film Permits

The Recreation Division Office handles the film permitting process for the City of Arcata. There were 2 requests for film permits in 2018.

Bayside Park Farm

The Bayside Park Farm is the first CSA (Community Supported Agriculture) in Arcata, providing the surrounding community with local and organic produce for 25 years. The farm is funded by the community; shareholders pledge their support in the spring and receive a share of the harvest every week for the growing season. As well as being a running CSA, the Bayside Park Farm is a permaculture park, demonstrating sustainable farming practices and appropriate means of energy use. Over the years, this farm has been managed by many generations of student farmers. Many notable farmers have learned to farm at Bayside Park Farm.



In 2018 the Farm supported 26 shareholders through the growing season (June through October). The Bayside Park Farm also offers Winter "You-Pick" Shares (November through February), supporting 12 shareholders.

In 2018 the Farm continued utilizing Interns. In addition, the Farm hosts community events such as garden herb walks, yoga, kids Tai-Chi and provides tours for local organizations and schools. The farm also donates produce to Food for People, the local food bank and other community organizations.

In 2018 the Parks Department received \$100,000 from the Crabs for the Arcata Ball Park upgrade, the balance will be provided by City Ball Park reserve funds to install new bleachers, a press box and improve ADA access at the Ball Park. These funds will be expended in 2019 when the actual construction occurs.

The Parks Department also received an anonymous donation of \$317,102 to construct a Futsal court at the Arcata Sports Complex. This project will be completed in 2019. The City also received a planning Grant from Caltrans for the development of plans for the Annie Mary trail that will eventually connect Arcata to Blue Lake along the historic Annie Mary Rail corridor.



Collaborations and Community Partners

The success of many recreation and park activities would not be possible without assistance from long standing community partners who risk both succeeding and/or failing with us. During 2018, the Parks and Recreation Divisions partnered with the following organizations:

Adopt-A-Park Program

Through the Adopt-A-Park program, community members and service groups volunteer their time and resources to perform weekly clean-up, exotic species removal, tree planting, painting, building maintenance, and landscape beautification. All City parks are included in this program.

AMPT Skate Shop

Ampt Skate Shop partners with the City to staff, sponsor and provide protective gear for youth during Skate Camp sessions at the Arcata Skate Park.

Arcata Elementary School District

Arcata Elementary School District continued to be a strong supporter of Recreation Programs. They allow us to utilize their gymnasium for Youth Basketball when necessary. Sunny Brae Middle School held their eighth grade graduation ceremonies for the twelfth year at the Arcata Community Center. The Recreation Division partners with Arcata Elementary to host the Annual Bowl of Beans Fundraiser. In addition, Arcata Elementary utilized the D Street Neighborhood Center for a talent show held in May. The Arcata Community Center also held the school's Winter Holiday Performance in December.

Arcata Chamber of Commerce

The Arcata Chamber of Commerce puts on the 4th of July Jubilee event on the Plaza.

Arcata Mainstreet

We continue to coordinate Winter Holiday events with Arcata Mainstreet. Additionally, Arcata Mainstreet showcases the plaza annually with the Oyster Festival which is estimated to bring 12,000 people to the plaza each year.

California Conservation Corps

The California Conservation Corps assisted with Bowl of Beans and plantings and invasive species removal.

Community Supported Activities

The Recreation Division hosts several different Community Supported Activities; Badminton, Basketball, Community Song Circle, Hula Dance, Samba Drumming, Table Tennis, Ukulele, and Volleyball. These groups meet on a weekly basis and allow players and singers of all ages and skill levels to participate. Very dedicated volunteers staff the activities allowing the City to offer these programs for a minimal drop-in fee.

First Five Humboldt

First Five Humboldt provides funding, educational and training resources, parent workshops and program staff support for the Arcata Play Center.

Fire Arts Center

City Arts programming is supported by the Fire Arts Center through the generous donation of bowls sold at the annual Bowl of Beans Benefit.

Friends of the Arcata Marsh

Did not provide programming to Marsh Camps in 2018.

Food for People, Inc.

The Recreation Division was fortunate to partner with Food for People to supply lunches again during the summer at Redwood Park. The lunches supplied by Food for People and served by City of Arcata Recreation staff are available to any child in our community.

Humboldt County Office of Education

A group from the Humboldt County Office of Education assists with the maintenance of the City Hall parking lot, planters and roundabouts. Additionally, the Recreation Division partnered with HCOE to update and showcase local quests through the Redwood Edventures Program.

Humboldt Crabs

The Humboldt Crabs continue their partnership with the City of Arcata assisting with the support of capital improvement projects. The Humboldt Crabs estimate that they have over 30,000 attendees annually.

Humboldt State University

The HSU Sierra Club/ Natural Resources Club continued their involvement at Sunny Brae Park performing trail renovation, tree planting, and exotic species removal. Our partnership with the Kinesiology and Recreation Administration Departments provides internships and special projects.

Jacoby Creek School

Jacoby Creek School provides gymnasium space for recreation basketball and other programs throughout the year. They are very helpful and flexible in the scheduling of the facility as we each work towards maximizing gym use during peak seasons. The cross country/track teams at Jacoby Creek School use fields at the Arcata Sports Complex for practices throughout the year and for the County Cross Country Championship in October. Additionally, the boys' and girls' basketball teams have used the Arcata Community Center throughout the year for practices and occasional tournaments.

Native Plant Society

Californian Native Plant Society volunteers continue to maintain the landscaping along the 7th Street walkway leading to the Arcata Community Center.

North Coast Community Garden Collaborative

The collaborative operates as a support network of and for community gardeners on California's north coast. The North Coast Community Garden Collaborative (NCCGC) works to bring community partners, gardens and gardeners together to improve access to affordable, healthy, fresh and culturally appropriate foods. NCCGC develops and delivers a monthly newsletter and provides community gardeners with opportunities for garden gatherings, educational events and sharing of resources.

Pacific Union School District

The Recreation Division is fortunate to receive time in the Pacific Union school gym for our basketball program and in turn Pacific Union used the Arcata Community Center for their awards night as well as graduation. The Pacific Union Field is also utilized for Physical Education classes and PUSD hosts a cross country race at the Marsh annually.

Plaza Garden Club

Through the Adopt-A-Park program various Arcata businesses assist with planting and maintaining Plaza flowerbeds.

Senior Resource Center

The Senior Resource Center utilizes the Arcata Community Center to serve daily lunches and provide social activities to seniors. Additionally, various rooms in the Arcata Community Center are utilized for weekly senior exercise and health screenings.

Special Olympics of Northern California

Special Olympics partnered with the Recreation Division to host the Annual Bocce Bonanza for local High School students with differing abilities at the Larson Park Bocce Courts and to provide the Young Athletes program for children ages 3 to 7.

United States Tennis Association

The USTA is the national governing body for the sport of tennis.

Parks and Recreation Committee: Accomplishments and Work Plan

Year 2018 Committee Members: Nancy Stark (January – July) & Sheldon Heath (August – December) - Chair; Deborah Coles , (January – July) & Nancy Stark (August – December) Vice-Chair; Zane Brotherton; Emily Michaels; Steven Martin; and Jayne McGuire.

Parks and Recreation Committee Recommendations to the City Council:

- ❖ Supported polling for an Open Space Funding Mechanism parcel tax to be levied for 15 years, and moving it to a vote if polling shows it likely to be successful; and to develop a protocol that would give structure on how funds would be used to be equitably distributed between open space, parks and recreation, wetlands and creeks and forest management.
- ❖ Adopted a meeting schedule to meet on the second Wednesday of odd-numbered months for august – December of 2018 located in the Council Chambers.
- ❖ Appointed Jayne McGuire as the Parks and Recreation Committee representative to the Plaza Improvement Task Force.
- ❖ Recommended following the guidelines set forth by the State for all trail and bikeways and revisiting the issue as needed if concerns arise on city trails.

Parks and Recreation Committee Accomplishments:

- ❖ Continued to support summer camp and year round recreational programs
- ❖ Held a scoping session and approved the conceptual development plan for Ennes Park upgrade completed in 2018.
- ❖ Approved a final concept design for Redwood Park with additional parking where possible and consideration of additional play space, possibly pickleball and/or horseshoe pits.
- ❖ Supported Six Rivers Montessori Storm Drain Stenciling Project marking drains on Hallen Drive and Valley East Blvd. and commended them for their efforts to clean up trash.
- ❖ Supported the city investigating establishing a bus stop at the skate park, with options to maintain parking.
- ❖ Participated in Valley West Walking Assessment in August.
- ❖ Approved moving forward with the Valley West basketball court design concept.
- ❖ Initiated discussion on increasing Plaza programming options.
- ❖ Supported Carlson park 30% design option based on feedback received at meetings and through the community survey.
- ❖ Received an update on the Annie and Mary Trail Planning process.
- ❖ Discussed the Forsyth Acquisition and recommended maintaining existing uses if there is no conflict between users and existing trail uses.
- ❖ Provided comments on the draft Parks Story Map to be added to the City website.
- ❖ Supported applying for funds to add Pickleball non-volley zone lines to City tennis courts

The Committee and the Parks and Recreation Divisions have a comprehensive work plan for the upcoming year. Our projects include:

- ❖ Complete Futsal Development at the Arcata Community Sports Complex
- ❖ Work with the Forest Management Committee to develop a plan for incorporating the Forsyth property into the Arcata Community Forest and maintain current uses as appropriate
- ❖ Look for funds to finalize the Carlson Park design and begin implementation
- ❖ Continue to review and provide guidance on revitalization of the Ball Park
- ❖ Explore options for additional recreational improvements and programs in the Valley West Area
- ❖ Support the Plaza Improvement Task Force's work
- ❖ Seek funding for Redwood Park engineering, design, and implementation of improvements as funding allows
- ❖ Continue to explore ways to generate additional revenue to support City parks, facilities, and recreation programs
- ❖ Continue Youth and Adult recreational programming and opportunities to expand to meet the community's needs
- ❖ Work with Community Development staff to update the Parks & Recreation element of the General Plan
- ❖ Continue to work towards incorporating slacklining in appropriate public spaces
- ❖ Further explore with other committees (Wetlands & Creeks and Forest Management Committees) funding for Open Space/Parks for the 2020 elections
- ❖ Reassess residential construction rate
- ❖ Continue to identify recreational programming and opportunities for special needs citizens and seniors
- ❖ Complete conceptual planning for the Annie and Mary Trail and seek funding for design and implementation
- ❖ Review and provide feedback on relevant development proposals
- ❖ Identify funding for and go out to bid for Shay Park construction

The Committee wants to thank the Council for their support this past year. We are excited about the community's upcoming projects and improving our communication with other City Committee's and the Council.






