

Why is Materials Management Important?

According to the Environmental Protection Agency (EPA), the total municipal solid waste (MSW) generated during 2018 was approximately 292.4 million tons. Living in a consumptive society results in many of us acquiring and disposing of goods in ever-increasing amounts. Continuous growth in generated waste causes ground, air, and water pollution, resulting in negative impacts on urban and rural ecosystems alike.

Although there are many obstacles, change is possible if we work collaboratively toward creating a zero-waste community. Zero waste can be achieved if we come together to implement an inclusive and comprehensive solution to minimize the waste generated in our community.

City of Arcata's Green Game Plan: The 6 R's

We are all familiar with the 3 R's – Reduce, Reuse, Recycle, but have you ever thought about why the R's are in this specific order? There is a reason "recycle" comes last. Before we even consider recycling, we should be trying to reduce the amount of waste we generate as well as reuse items we already have instead of buying new ones. Once we have reduced and reused as much as possible, only then should we start recycling.

Furthermore, we realized that the 3 R's were not sufficient to combat the ever-increasing demand for more "stuff" and a society of convenience culture. The City of Arcata has an updated Green Game Plan: the 6 R's – **Reduce, Reuse, Rot (compost), Recycle, Responsible Disposal, and Rethink**.



The Purpose of This Guide

While reducing and reusing waste should always be the first step taken, it is important that the residents of Arcata have the information they need to recycle and responsibly dispose of waste when prevention is not an option. Recycling

Once you reduce, reuse, and rot (compost) as much as you can but are still left with potential “trash”, it is time to start recycling any remaining eligible waste. Always keep in mind that recycling does not automatically mean diversion from the landfill. Many items that are put into recycling bins do not get recycled due to a myriad of reasons (costs for materials changing, recycling stream contamination, and more). Not to mention that materials most often get downcycled into lower-quality materials, meaning that they will eventually end up in the landfill.

Recyclables Eligible for Curbside Pick-up

That being said, it is still important to try to recycle what you can. The City of Arcata has a single-stream (commingled) curbside recycling system. This means all recycling is placed into a single bin. See the chart below for what items are eligible to be recycled in the Arcata curbside recycling program.

Responsible Disposal (Landfill)

Many of you have done your best to minimize waste up to this point; however, you may still end up with some waste that can neither be reused nor recycled. If this is the case, it is important that you ensure you properly sort your waste in a way that has the least impact on the environment. Responsible disposal means properly disposing of hazardous and pharmaceutical waste and taking any remaining waste to appropriate facilities.

Arcata's garbage is transported to the Humboldt Waste Management Authority's Hawthorne Street facility in Eureka. It is dumped onto the station tip floor and lifted by an excavator into a trailer. Tip floor personnel try to remove recoverable items, such as unpainted or untreated lumber, steel or metal items, drywall, or inert materials like brick or concrete. These recovered items go to local diversion outlets. The trailer is loaded with 22 to 23 tons of garbage and then hauled a long distance to landfills in either Anderson, CA, or Medford, OR. The garbage is compacted with a loader into the "active face" of the landfill and eventually covered with suitable daily cover (either 6" of soil or other approved materials).

Materials Eligible to be Disposed of in Curbside Pick-up

Many items that cannot be recycled in curbside programs can be disposed of in curbside services. See the items below that can be placed in landfill bins.

¹Bioplastics/compostable plastics are not recyclable/compostable in Arcata. Bioplastics are only designed to biodegrade when placed in a commercial composting system, a system which does not currently exist in our area.

²Indicates that items are compostable if you have a backyard composting set-up.

³When the covers are removed, the rest can be recycled.

Materials that Require Responsible Disposal (No Curbside!)

Certain items cannot be placed in curbside bins because they require a proper disposal method. Please do not place the following items in either recycling or landfill curbside totes because they contain materials that are hazardous if not properly handled.

Rethink Waste

There may always be certain materials that are difficult to avoid disposing of in everyday life, and making sure to responsibly recycle and dispose of those items is important. That being said, preventing and reducing waste, as well as reusing, will always be the most effective tools in terms of waste reduction.

A great place to start with waste reduction is to understand what sort of waste you generate the most. Performing a household waste audit can provide you with a much better grasp of what your home contributes to the waste stream. There are lots of great resources (<https://mygreenmontgomery.org/project/conduct-a-home-waste-audit/>) on how to perform household waste audits.

Figuring out your biggest waste “offenders” is crucial before addressing what can be tangibly changed. This process can be overwhelming, but it is not something that has to be done all at once. Step-by-step is the best way to go about adjusting to a more waste-conscious lifestyle.

After you have reduced what you can, the next best step would be to reuse materials. Reusing can require some creative thinking. Once you are in that mindset, however, you will be surprised by how many different ways you can reuse something that otherwise might be going to the landfill!
