**YES! Everything on this list goes into one can!**

- Newspaper and Inserts
- Magazines, Catalogs
- Cardboard, flattened
- Soda/beer boxes
- Chipboard  
(cereal & food boxes, etc.)
- Home & Office Paper
- Junk Mail & Envelopes
- Brown Paper Bags
- Paper Board
- Construction Paper
- File Folders
- Paper egg cartons
- Bottle Caps
- Metal Jar Lids & Steel
- Glass Jars & Bottles (all colors)  
(remove lids)
- #1- #7 Plastic Bottles & Containers  
(no lids)
- Aluminum & Bimetal Cans
- Steel & Tin Cans
- Aluminum Foil & Formed Containers
- Paper Gift Wrap
- Phone & Paperback Books
- Paper milk and juice cartons (no caps)

## Remember...

Don't overstuff the cans! Can lids must be completely closed for cans to be collected. Face your bin with the handle towards the house in an unobstructed location.



## These items are **NOT** accepted at curbside collection

Chip bags \* Snack wrappers \* Styrofoam (meat trays, etc.) \* Compostable plastics \* Plastic utensils & straws \* Durable plastic goods (chairs, toys, totes, etc.) \* Photographs \* Carry-out coffee cups \* Paper towels \* Tissues \* Paper plates \* Waxed paper \* Ice-cream boxes \* Waxed cardboard (frozen/refrigerated food or drink boxes) \* Pizza boxes \* Scrap metal \* Hardcover books \* Plastic bags

**If in doubt, throw it out**
